The non-profit started in 2014 and has quickly expanded marking over 20,000 attendees for both online and in-person events offered across Canada. With the expansion, comes the need for adequate representation. "We believe these ladies reflect the values of the organization and are excited for the future of our partnership," Hachem-Fawaz says.

Rebecca Chenier, Red Seal General Machinist

As a single mom with 3 children, finding a financially stable job wasn't easy. Rebecca came across a flyer for a Millwright pre-apprenticeship training program offered by Women's Enterprise Skills Training of Windsor. She applied for the program and after three years of her apprenticeship, she challenged the Red Seal exam and passed. Of the trades, Rebbeca says, "It gave me financial independence...It was empowering and freeing. I have no words to express how incredible that feels."

Delaney Krieger, 2nd Year Carpenter's Apprentice, *Carpenters Union Local 494*Delaney attended a Build A Dream career expo where she met representatives from the carpenters union. Despite plans to pursue journalism, Delaney realized that she didn't want a desk job and signed on as a drywall, acoustics, and lather apprentice. "I love it so far. You get a bit of experience on everything."
