With prevailing labour shortages persisting across key economic sectors, Build a Dream welcomes the Ontario government's continued commitment to addressing the pressing challenges facing Ontario's skilled trades sector. The organization applauds several measures announced in the province's budget that support skills development and apprenticeships for Ontario's youth. These include:

- Addressing the challenges in the recruitment and retention of workers through an additional \$100 million in 2024-25 to equip workers, including apprentices, with the skills needed to advance in their careers.
- Expanding access to skilled trades training centres to prepare workers for the emerging and in-demand jobs of tomorrow.
- Investing over \$62.9 million to help more young people explore career opportunities in the skilled trades through the expansion of the Ontario Youth Apprenticeship Program (OYAP) and the launch of pre-apprenticeship training projects across the province.
